Here is the line-up and as always, there are 2 each of the first four wines (*) and 1 each of the last four wines. *La Ronciere 2022 Pinot Noir "Cantoalba," Licanten, Chile –(100% Pinot Noir) A silky smooth cool climate Pinot Noir that sees 30% used oak for 4 months. Aromas of red and black fruit such as bright cherry, raspberry, currant with violet and subtle forest floor elements. Soft velvety tannins make it easy to drink. A tremendous value.

- *Val de Salis 2021 Viognier, Pays d'Oc, France (100% Viognier) A finely textured, medium bodied Viognier with notes of white peach, and honeysuckle, finishing with good acidity. Nicely balanced and welcoming, it would be perfect for roasted or fried chicken.
- *Dal Maso 2023 Cabernet IGT, Veneto, Italy (50% Cabernet Sauvignon, 50% Cabernet Franc) This wine, produced in the Berici Hills DOC zone, is an easy-to-drink wine, with intense scents of red fruit, violets and light spicy notes. The palate is soft, full-bodied with pleasant tannins and is a good everyday red wine.

- *Torrent Bay 2023 Sauvignon Blanc, Nelson, New Zealand (100% Sauvignon Blanc) Herbal and crisp with notes of green apple and gooseberry. Unmistakably New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc. Light weight and balanced with a wet stone finish.
- San Vito 2022 Chianti, Tuscany, Italy (100% Sangiovese) Medium bodied and nicely balanced with aromas of cherries raspberries and currants finishing bright with soft tannins.

Chateau Meilhan 2022 Rouge, Médoc, Bordeaux, France - (47% Cabernet Sauvignon, 50% Merlot, 3% Petit Verdot) Notes of blackcurrant, licorice and roasted herbs with a touch of Coca-Cola. Medium bodied, ripe, with good acidity and ripe young Médoc tannins. A great bargain for a Medoc!

It complements all types of seafood, from oysters to grilled fish.

Domaine Farmaki 2023 Preknadi White, Naoussa, Greece – (100% Preknadi) Produced from the indigenous Naoussa grape Preknadi, this distinctive and delicious wine has notes of Granny Smith apple peels and floral blossoms with a slight saline touch and crisp, mineral driven finish.

"The 2018 Faro takes its time opening in the glass, dark and dusty in character, with smoldering ashen stones and dried herbs slowly settling into steeped plums and mint. It's silky, sleek and racy in feel, with pure red and blue fruit carried across a streak of zesty acidity. This finishes tannic, as a young Faro should, yet it is rounder than expected. The 2018 leaves hints of black raspberry and citrus to mingle. This may not have the depth and complexity of the best vintage, but it will provide an earlier drinking window and plenty of pleasure over the medium term." These are white wines that benefit from a brief decant. Young and tight at first, the wine opens to revel lovely lemon, quince and flinty notes with a touch of salinity on a zesty, minerally finish perfect with your fresh oysters! With the deep golden color of an aged Saviennieres, the Massis has hints of a dry sherry, along with notes of salted almonds, dried tart apricots, and delicate chamomile. A perfect pairing with black bean nachos or blue cheese stuffed olives.

We are organized by place, not attribute, but as the wine world has made a healthy move toward better farming practices we needed to find a quick way to identify organic, biodynamic, sustainable and natural wines.

RETURN POLICY

J. Emerson, Inc. guarantees that each bottle of wine we sell is in good condition. If you purchase a bad bottle of wine from us, please bring the bottle (with wine) back promptly. We will taste the wine with you to try and ascertain what has gone wrong and we will replace the bad bottle with a good bottle of the same wine. We are not responsible for any damage that occurs after the wine has left the store. This is especially true in the

summer. PLEASE do not leave your wine in your car or trunk. It takes less than two hours in 80-90 degree sun to "pop" a cork. We will NOT accept any returns of warm or hot bottles. Returns should come back to us at about the same temperature as our store.

OUR PROTOCAL FOR USING WINE REVIEWS

Throughout our newsletter you will find profiles of wine tastes and flavors written by professional wine reviewers. We use these reviews, when they align with our own tasting notes, because, frankly, these reviewers use descriptors and adjectives that are more interesting and often more on point than what we would write. When we use a reviewers notes we will always use quotes and we will always show attribution, i.e.: WA — Wine Advocate, WS- Wine Spectator, BH — Burghound and Vinous for... Vinous. Three of these review sources are reader subscription only and carry no advertising and they are: WA, Vinous and BH, and thus those are primary review sources. Each review source also has reviewers that are better in some specialty then others. For example, Antonio Galloni has a wonderful sense of Italian wines and Allen Meadows of Burghound is a definitive source for the wines of Burgundy. The other key is that these reviews need to align with our tasting notes and if there is a huge discrepancy we will defer to our notes, which may be less interesting in terms of descriptors, but more in harmony with the wine profile. Our tasting notes would be any review without quotation marks.

OUR WINE ENVIORNMENT

If you shop here you already know that we take the condition of the wine environment in the store very seriously. Wines are on their side, we monitor humidity and the temperature on the main floor never rises about 63 degrees. (In the winter we strive for 60.) We use no fluorescent lighting in the wine areas – THE WORST POSSIBLE LIGHTING CONDITION due to the high UV content. Instead we have been using indirect incandescent lighting. Now we are in the process of converting our lighting to LED, a source that produces NO UV light rays! Does your wine retailer care enough to take these quality control steps? Ask questions next time you are in a big box retailer.
